INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Our Children's Groups for our children and young people meet in the Church at 11.00am for the first part of Morning Worship. After the second song, they go up to the 1st floor of the Hall for their groups, and then rejoin parents for refreshments in the Hall at the end of the service. Please note that all children must be accompanied to Church. The groups follow a lively programme, which includes fun, games, music and a variety of activities like drawing, colouring, acting and drama and a range of crafts. The material we use is based on the LIGHT series, published by Scripture Union.

The Groups meet as follows:

The Crèche (up to 4 years) in Meeting Room 3

Splash (4 years to 8 years) in Meeting Room 1

Xstream (9 years to 12 years) in Meeting Room 1

The Grid (12 years and beyond) in the Lounge

On the 2nd Sunday of each month, we all worship together in Church, though the Quiet Room, just off the Church, is also available for parents with small babies.

There is no charge for children and young people - the Church pays all the costs of the groups. There is a collection taken as the children leave Church - this money is set aside to support Elizabeth Namambo, an 11-year-old girl who lives in Uganda and who is supported by Compassion UK through us.

All the teachers are, of course, volunteers who are all members of the Church - and who have all been officially checked through the Criminal Records Bureau via the Diocese of St Albans, so you can be reassured that your children will be in safe hands. The Church also has a Child Protection Policy, a copy of which is displayed in the Porch. If you have any concerns, please do not hesitate to speak to the Reverend Michael Burns or one of the Churchwardens or the Children's Group Leaders.

We also encourage our young people to take part, if they wish, in running the Church - such as acting as Welcomers, taking up the Collection, taking part in a Drama for the whole Church. A number of our young people also sing in the Choir (at the 9.15am service) and in the Music Group (at the 11am service). There is also the opportunity every year for our older young people (at least 12 years and over) to be prepared for admission as full members of the Church by being Confirmed.

ACT 4 is an official registered charity, which is supported by the Churches in Potters Bar (including KCM), which provides educational and youth programmes across the town. In particular they run regular youth groups to which our young people are welcome. Please ask for further details (665551)
